Dear Mara Beth,

The application of the American Jack Russell Terrier Club was very straight forward in submitting the Australian/FCI Jack Russell Terrier for inclusion in to the AKC FSS. We submitted the FCI standard for the breed in our original application.

The American Jack Russell Terrier Club was told we could not use the FCI standard for the breed by Patricia Lejman instructing us to write one. We attempted to reconstruct the FCI standard in our terminology which was a mistake on our part. Anything but the the FCI standard would change our original application for the Australian/FCI type of Jack Russell Terrier. The Australians and the members of FCI have already viewed this as not being the same breed if the standard is changed in anyway. It is imperative we line up with Australia and the FCI countries as the same breed. If we do not line up with the rest of the world, it will infringe on the rights of our members to import and export stock from country of development and other FCI countries to expand our gene pool. It would also prevent our members from competing on an international basis in the show venue. The simple fact we can't use the proper name for the breed presents enough of a challenge to overcome.

The American Jack Russell Terrier Club and its members are withdrawing the standard we wrote and will again resubmit the Australian/FCI standard for approval to be applied to the breed. I will be mailing a copy of this letter to you with the FCI standard.
