To achieve the Breeder of Merit designation, breeders should:

- * Certify that applicable health screens are performed on the sire and dam as recommended by the Parent Club.
- * Hold membership in an AKC club.
- * Have a history of at least 5 years involvement with AKC events.
- * Earn Conformation, Companion and/or Performance titles on at least 4 dogs they have bred/co-bred.
- * Demonstrate their commitment to ensuring 100% of the puppies they produce are AKC registered.

As part of the Breeder of Merit program, breeders will receive:

- * Complimentary access to \$20.00 value per month for free online reports in the AKC online store.
- * Access to the AKC Direct toll free number.
- * Online Record support to ensure that their records are accurate, complete and easily accessible.
- * A frameable certificate of distinction.
- * Free Online Breeder Classified listings

along with a special Breeder of Merit designation.

* Acknowledgement on a special page of the AKC website and in the AKC Gazette.

* Free or discounted fees on all secondary transactions such as duplicate registration applications,

revoke limited status applications, etc.

* Breeder of Merit web banner for display on their website.

* Breeder of Merit lapel pin.

* Breeder of Merit designation and gold border on registration applications and certificates for dogs bred by the Breeder of Merit.



This is just one of the many benefits of becoming a recognized breed in the most respected Kennel Club in the world. The AKC is always working to assist all dog breeds become the best they can be. We are so fortunate to have all of the AKC Programs available to us.

Hope to see all of you at our Annual Russell Terrier Specialty and AGM. Best of luck to those who are going to participate at Eukanuba representing our breed.

National Specialty & AGM 2010



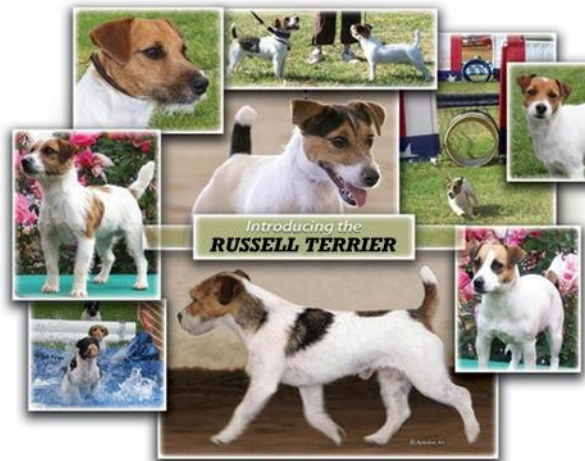

One Year in the Life of an AKC Russell Terrier

One Year in the Life of an AKC Russell Terrier

January 1st 2010 was not just a new year for the American Russell Terrier Club. It was a milestone. For the first time The American Kennel Club of America allowed them to enter dog shows in Miscellaneous Class. Now they were just one step away from the real thing.

Fox Island Nina traveled from Florida to California to participate in the Orange Empire Kennel Club Show in San Bernardino January 30. What a kickoff to her show career when, first show, first day of the show, she was named Best In Show Miscellaneous.

After the show she traveled to Ecuador and registered as a Jack Russell Terrier according to the FCI, AERCAN rules in South America. She passed her aptitude test and quickly earned her Championship title.

What a sad day it was, July 14, when her owners, Tony and Lynda Pratt, returned home to find the back of her enclosure cut open. Nina and a Parson Russell Terrier named Quipu Chasqui had been stolen. Everyday they searched in vain. When filing the police report

the officer asked "How much are your dogs worth?" To which they replied "How much are your children worth?" The police noted their AKC registration number and their microchip numbers in the report which helped them a

great deal to understand these were no ordinary pets.

Posters were put up at all the most frequented places. Vets, pet shops, groom shops, and feed stores were all notified and supplied with photos.

After 5 days it was the radio announcement that finally brought them home. It seems they had escaped from their captures (a Jack Russell legacy). They were brought home by a woman whose neighbor told her the 2 dogs she had found matched the description on the radio.

What an exciting day it was when she arrived at the front gate with Nina and Quipu!

Quipu Chasqui, a smooth coated Parson Russell now works as a professional canine therapy dog at the Solca Hospital in the capitol of Ecuador and plans to travel the world in 2011 giving comfort and hope to children with cancer and paralysis.

On October 25 Nina boarded a plane in Quito to travel 3,000 miles back to California. She has been invited to the prestigious 10th annual Eukanuba Dog Show held in Long

Beach, CA December 4,5.

What a year it has been for this fantastic little bitch! And its not over yet!

Importance of Registering All Dogs

Registering All Your Dogs Has Never Been More Important

Each year AKC registrations continue to decline. That's not a good thing when you consider that registrations are AKC's core "product" and revenue source, and that so many of AKC's programs rely on the funding that registrations provide.

Think about all that registrations do. Along with helping your events remain affordable and keeping our beloved traditions alive, registrations support your American Kennel Club's "good works" efforts in other aspects of the purebred dog world. For example, **maintaining a strong legislative influence** has never been more important for those of us involved in the responsible breeding of dogs. Over the past three years, the size of AKC's legislative portfolio, which tracks issues related to dogs, has almost tripled—from 406 issues in 2007 to over 1040 through June of 2010. With no end to this legislative onslaught in sight, it is key that registrations continue to help AKC maintain a strong legislative influence on behalf of all responsible dog breeders.

Registration dollars continue to assist in funding another vitally important part of the purebred dog world—**canine health research**. Since its creation in 1995, the AKC Canine Health Foundation (CHF) has allocated more than \$24 million to canine health research. During that time, AKC proudly supported the foundation's efforts by contributing nearly \$20 million to approved research grants and day-to-day program costs. The alliance between the American Kennel Club and the CHF has provided funding for research projects that spurred the development of important new genetic tests. These allow breeders to further assess breeding stock and

help prevent illnesses in future generations, as well as provide more accurate diagnoses and better treatments. CHF also sponsors, along with the Orthopedic Foundation for Animals, the Canine Health Information Center (CHIC). The CHIC database provides participating parent clubs a resource for breeders to research and maintain information on specific health issues that may be prevalent in their breeds.

Your Registrations help AKC:

- ***Maintain a strong legislative influence***
- ***Fund canine health research***
- ***Provide disaster relief***
- ***Promote responsible dog ownership***

Along with AKC Companion Animal Recovery (CAR), the AKC plays a significant role in our country's largest **disaster relief efforts**. During Hurricane Katrina in 2005, both AKC and CAR delivered vital aid and provided multiple airlifts for displaced dogs in dire need of help. AKC knows, too, that the best way to address a disaster is through preparation. Throughout the first half of 2010, the AKC CAR Canine Support and Relief Fund has donated nearly \$400,000 to organizations across the nation, including more than \$215,000 in grants to search and rescue organizations for equipment and preparedness training.

Registrations also contribute to the funding of another important facet of the American Kennel Club—**promoting responsible dog ownership** through educational programs. *AKC Responsible Dog*

Ownership (RDO) Days happen each year throughout September. Although unique RDO Day events are held all over the country, each is entertaining and educational, and many include agility, obedience and rally demonstrations. Attendees can speak one-on-one with experienced dog breeders and trainers, as well as veterinarians and technicians, to learn what's best for them and their dog. Registrations also fund educational programs like *Safety Around Dogs* and *Best Friends*, which bring responsible dog ownership lessons to schools and other community venues.

It is easy to understand why addressing the problem of falling registrations is key to a strong future for the purebred dog world. You can do your part by ensuring that all the puppies you produce are registered with AKC. Meanwhile, AKC will continue to introduce new services to make your job as responsible dog breeders and owners easier and to honor your dedication to your breed and the sport. By working together, we will be able to take the necessary steps to ensure AKC's long and healthy future as the nation's preeminent purebred dog registry while continuing all the good works we provide for you and all responsible dog breeders and owners.

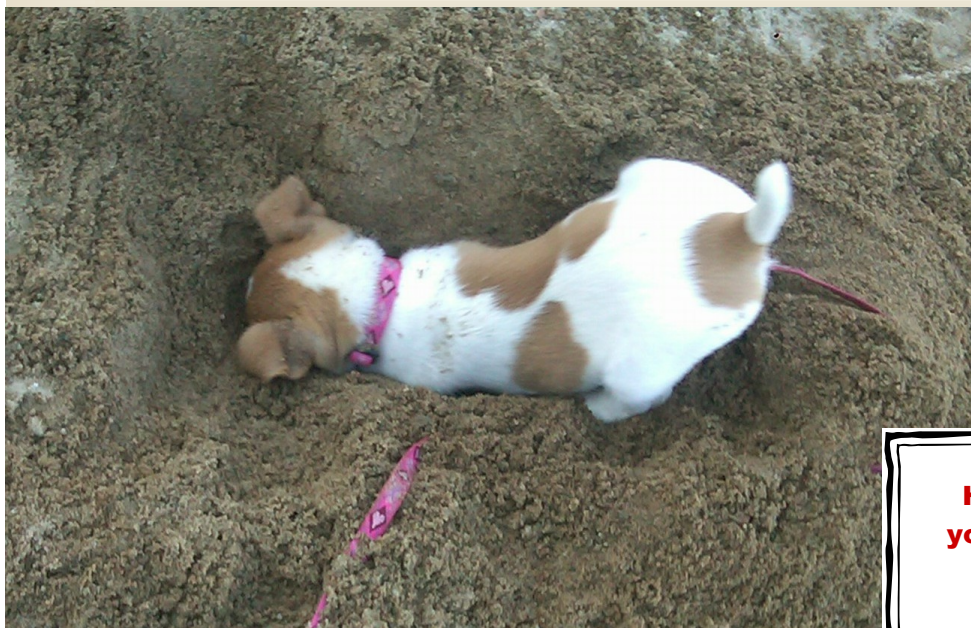

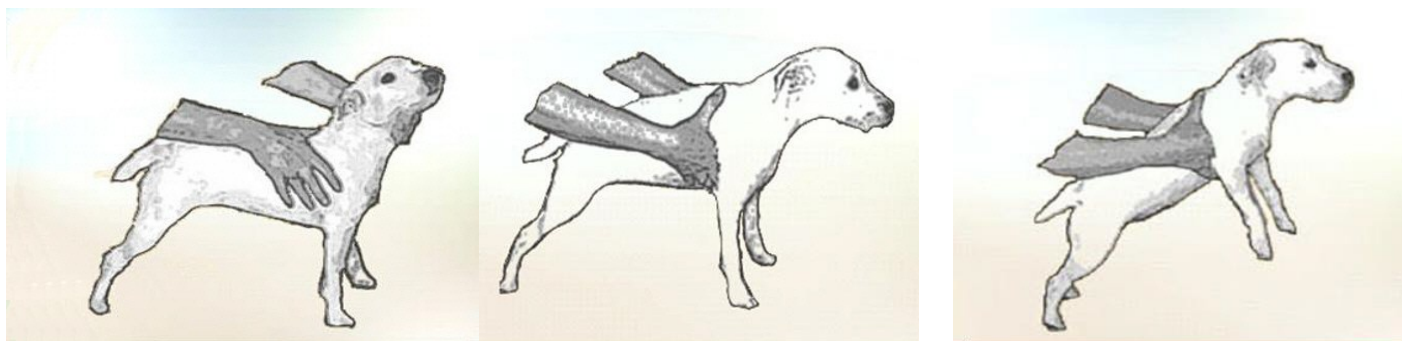

“Spanability is the Hallmark for The Russell Terrier”

SPANNING GUIDE

Of critical importance to maintaining correct Russell Terrier Breed Type is the process of spanning and the judges ability to assimilate that information into the evaluation process. The procedure takes seconds to complete, most exhibitors will be happy to assist you. You are to access three important features: the dogs chest size (14”-15”), chest shape (oval) and the compressibility of the chest. Failure to span or doing so incorrectly adversely affects and forever alters correct Breed Type.



While on the table move the rear of the dog toward you so the tail-end is closest to you.

Slide your hands around the chest, thumbs meeting over the withers and fingers meeting at the mid-line.

Raise the dog onto the back legs, then exert slight pressure on the rib cage top to bottom.

“Learning to properly span your terrier is the only way to accurately measure the size of the chest as it relates to the standard.”



Miscellaneous Class

New title Available for Miscellaneous Breeds

Section 23. The Miscellaneous Class shall be for purebred dogs of such breed as may be designated by the AKC® Board of Directors. No dog shall be eligible for entry in the Miscellaneous Class unless the owner has been granted an AKC identification number, and unless the AKC identification number is given on the entry form. Application for an AKC identification number shall be made on a form provided by the AKC and when submitted must be accompanied by a fee set by the Board of Directors.

The regular Miscellaneous Classes for each breed shall be Puppy and Open, with the same eligibility requirements in Sections 4 and 9 of the Chapter respectively. These classes shall be divided by sex. All class winners within a breed shall compete for Best of Breed and Best of Opposite Sex to Best of Breed.

Each of the Miscellaneous Class Best of Breed winners shall be eligible to compete for Best in Miscellaneous Class. All entries for Best in Miscellaneous Class shall be made after judging of the individual Miscellaneous breed classes and no entry fee shall be charged. In the event that the owner of a dog designated Best of

Breed shall not exhibit the dog in the Best of Miscellaneous Class Competition, no other dog of the same breed shall be allowed to compete. There shall be no further competition for dogs entered in the Miscellaneous Class.

Winners of the Best of Breed and Best of Opposite Sex to Best of Breed in each of the individual miscellaneous breeds will be awarded points towards the Certificate of Merit (CM) title based on the number of dogs defeated. Upon completion of the CM title a dog may continue to compete in the Miscellaneous class so long as they are of an eligible breed. The CM suffix title is an introductory title to AKC conformation events and will be superseded by the CH title when earned. The Certificate of Merit requires 15 points awarded in accordance with the following point structure:

<u>Dogs Competing</u>	<u>Points</u>
2	1
4	2
8	3

16	5



The ribbon shall conform to Chapter 5, Section 2 of these rules and shall be the following colors:

- * First Prize - Rose
- * Second Prize - Brown
- * Third Prize - Light Green
- * Fourth Prize - Gray
- * Best of Breed - Orange
- * Best of Opposite - Lavender
- * Best in Miscellaneous - Pink and Green

At present, the Miscellaneous Class is open to the following breeds:

1. American English Coonhound
2. Cesky Terrier
3. Chinook
4. Entlebucher Mountain Dog

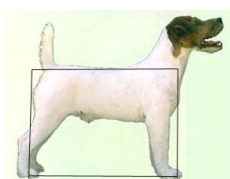

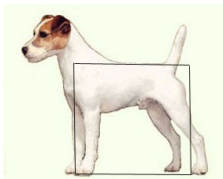
